2) Welcome & Memory Verse

We are going to learn that God is our protector. Can you all say protector? (Allow responses.) Good job. God is our protector. We are going to see how God protects his people by learning about the life of David!

The verse is from the Bible in the book of 2 Samuel. “The Lord is my protector; He is my strong fortress.” 2 Samuel 22:2 (GNT) Now, let me show you with the motions.

The Lord (Make an L with your right hand, place it up by your left shoulder, and bring it down to your right hip.)

Is my protector; (Bring your arms up crossed like an X in front of your face.)

He (Point up.)

Is my strong (Make muscles with your arms.)

Fortress (Bring your fingertips together above your head as if under a house or tent.)

2 Samuel 22:2 (Hold up two fingers on one hand and then alternate with the other while saying the verse reference.)

Okay, now let's do it together. (Repeat.)

Good job, we will keep working on the memory verse each week.
