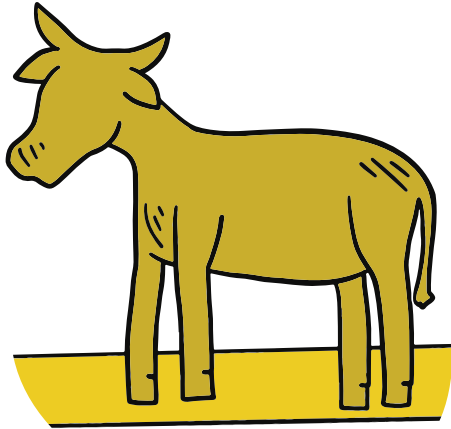


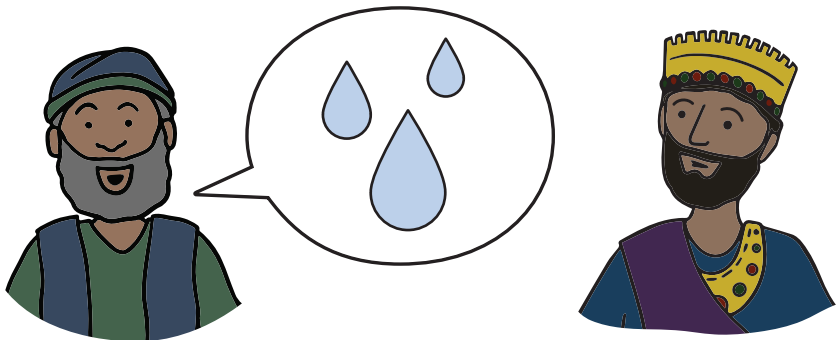
Elijah was a prophet when
King Ahab was the king of Israel.



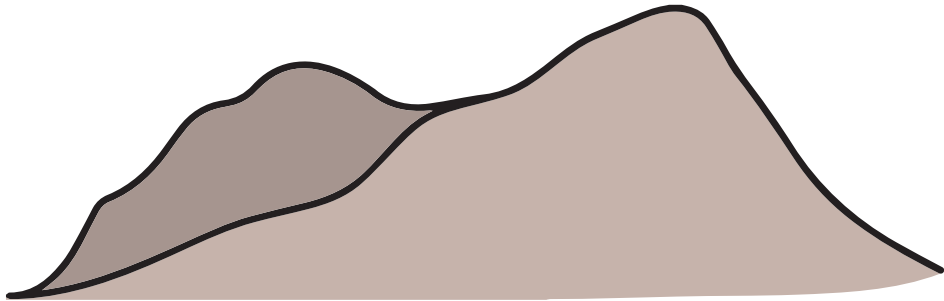
King Ahab worships a idol called Baal, but God wants people to worship him only.

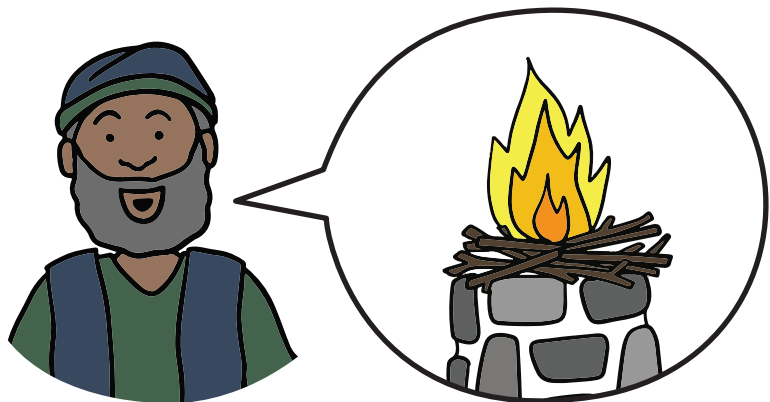
King Ahab agrees,

Mount Carmel for the contest.



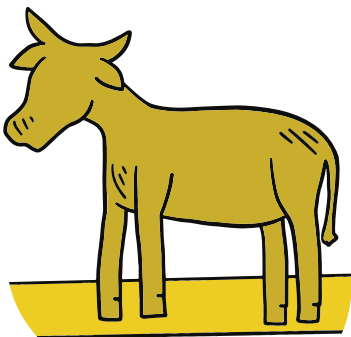
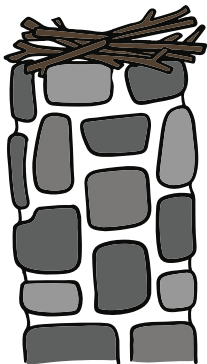
Elijah tells the people to build two altars—one to God and one to Baal—and to bring animals for the sacrifices.



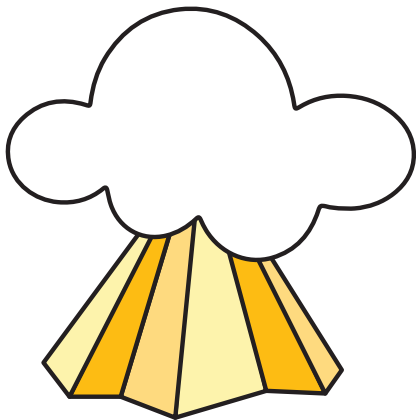
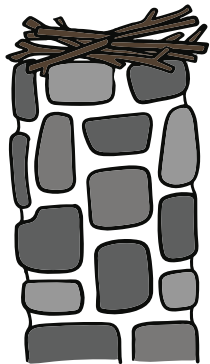
Elijah says, “Pray to your god,

down is the one and only God.”



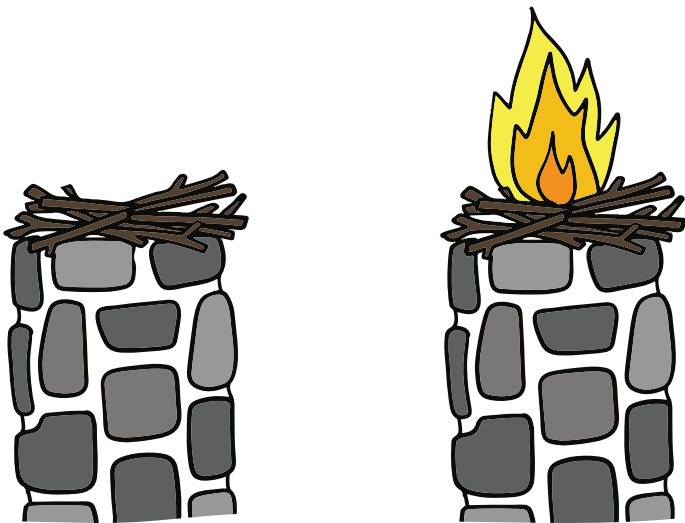
The prophets of Baal build their altar, prepare their sacrifice, and they pray all day to Baal, but there is **NO ANSWER!**
