



## Holy – Lesson 3

### Memory Verse: Romans 6:23

“For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus.” (KJV)

### Key Point: Jesus saves us from our sin.

### Bible Verse: Matt. 26:36-46, Mark 14:32-50, Luke 22:40-46

### SCHEDULE:

#### Center Time

#### Five Finger Gospel (optional)

**LESSON:**

This is a story from Mark 14 in the Bible. **After the Passover meal, Jesus knows it is his time to give his life for our sins** (1). So, after **Jesus and his disciples** finish the Passover meal, they leave the room and **go to a special place called the Garden of Gethsemane** (2).

When Jesus goes to the Garden of Gethsemane, he takes three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John, into the garden. **He asks Peter, James, and John to watch and pray** (3). Then Jesus goes a little further, kneels on the ground, and begins to pray. Jesus knows he has something hard to do. The thing Jesus is about to do is going to be very hard, but it is the reason he has come to Earth.

**Jesus needs to talk to God**, his Father, **to get strength and comfort** (4). **After Jesus prays** for a little while, **he goes back** to where his disciples are **and finds that Peter, James, and John are asleep** (5). **Jesus wakes them up and again asks them to watch and pray** (6) with him. **He** goes a little further away and **prays again** (7).

The second time **Jesus goes to talk to his disciples, they are asleep again** (8), because they are very tired. Jesus decides to let them sleep, and he goes back to pray a third time. **After praying** for a while, **Jesus knows that it is time**. **Judas**, the disciple who has betrayed him, **and the soldiers are on the way** (9). Jesus goes and wakes his disciples. Judas and the soldiers come into the garden with spears and clubs. Judas lets the soldiers know which one is Jesus, and they arrest him. One of Jesus' disciples, Peter, tries to stop the soldiers. He takes a sword and cuts off the ear of one of the soldiers! But, **Jesus** immediately heals the soldier's ear and **goes willingly with them** (10).

**Key Point:** Jesus saves us from our sin.
