Memory Verse: Exodus 14:13a “But Moses told the people, ‘Don’t be afraid. Just stand still and watch the Lord rescue you today.’”

Key Point: God provides for his people!

Bible Verse: Exodus 3–4:17

SCHEDULE:

Lesson

Five Finger Gospel (optional)

LESSON:

While **Moses** is taking care of some **sheep** near **Mount Sinai** (1), **God causes a bush to catch on fire**, but the bush does **not burn up** (2)! The bush that Moses sees is not burning up. **Moses thinks this is strange, so he goes closer to check it out** (3).

Then **Moses** hears a voice coming from the bush saying, “**Moses, Moses!** (4)” Moses says, “Here I am.” **God is speaking to Moses out of the bush** (5)! **God** says, “**Do not come near. Take off your sandals, because you are standing on holy ground.** (6)”

God tells Moses he **wants Moses to bring God's people out of Egypt** (7). Moses is very afraid and makes many excuses as to why he can't do what God is asking him to do. **Moses** says he **is afraid the people won't listen to him** (8), that he isn't a good speaker, and that his brother, Aaron, would be a better choice. God says, “I will be with you.”

Then **God gives Moses many signs and miracles to do** (9), to let the people know he is giving them God's message. God tells Moses that Aaron can go with him and speak for him.

Finally, **Moses** agrees and **says “Yes” to what God wants him to do** (10). God chooses Moses and he takes care of Moses. God gives Moses everything he needs to do what God is asking him to do. Moses isn't sure he can do the job at first, but finally he agrees to do what God asks. Moses agrees because he believes God's promise to be with him.

God provides everything Moses needs to be able to do what God wants. God will provide what we need in order to do what he asks us to do. We can trust God and not be afraid to do whatever he asks of us.

Key Point: God provides for his people!**Review Questions**

Group A	Group B
What is Moses taking care of at the beginning of the story? (Sheep)	What does Moses see while he is taking care of the sheep? (A burning bush.)
Does the ground catch on fire? (No)	Who speaks to Moses from the bush? (God.)
Did the bush on fire burn up? (No)	God asks Moses to be the leader of his people. Does Moses want to do that?
Who does God want Moses to bring out of Egypt? (God's people/Israelites)	(No. Moses is afraid.)
Is Moses afraid to go? (Yes)	What does God tell Moses he will do? (God will be with Moses and help him.)
Does Moses decide to go anyway even though he is scared? (Yes)	Does Moses say “Yes” to God? (He does finally say “Yes.”)
