



All-Knowing – Lesson 4

Memory Verse: Hebrews 1:1 “Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets...”

Key Point: God knows everything!

Bible Verse: Isaiah 9, Isaiah 53, Isaiah 55

SCHEDULE:

Five Finger Gospel (optional)

LESSON:

God sends prophets to speak to his people a lot **because** his people forget two very important things. **They forget to love God** the most **and** they **stop obeying God** (1). They do not listen to God and do what he has told them to do. **God knows that his people need help** so that they can love **and** obey him. **He has a plan to help them** (2). **Isaiah the prophet** is sent by God with some messages to give God's people, and Isaiah **goes to the people to share God's message with them about God's plans** (3) long before they would even happen:

My people, you are all like sheep. **You have wandered away from me**. You have gone your own way **and now you are lost** (4). I cannot stop loving you. **I am going to send a Shepherd to lead you** in the way you should go. He will carry you **back to me** (5).

My people, you are totally lost in darkness. I am going to send a great light to guide you back to me. My people, **sin has taken over how you all live** (6) and you do not get along. **I am going to send you a Prince of Peace** (7). He will be a son from King David's family. **He will come as a little baby boy** in a special way **to a young mom who doesn't have a husband** (8). He will grow to be a king who can take care of you. **His name will be "Emmanuel," which means God has come to live with us, and he** will come to rescue you and show you how to love and obey God. He, **Jesus, will take away your sin** and darkness. Jesus will be your shepherd, your light, **and** your king to **bring you back to God** (9).

And then, **one day, all sin and darkness**, and all sadness **will be gone**. The mountains **and** trees will praise him. **The whole earth will** shout his name and **see his glory** (10). This is my plan, and I will do it because I love you!

God sent Jesus to save us from our sin. God made a way for us to love him and have a relationship with him through Jesus! God knows everything, and he did just what he said he would do!

Key Point: God knows everything!
