



## Healer – Lesson 4

**Memory Verse:** Psalm 103:3 “He forgives all my sin. He heals all my sickness.”

**Key Point:** God has the power to heal!

**Bible Verse:** Luke 17:11–17

### SCHEDULE:

#### Center Time

*around 10 minutes*

Help the individuals transition by actively engaging them from the beginning. Try setting up centers to color, play with blocks and Play-Doh, or do puzzles.

#### Five Finger Gospel (optional)

**LESSON:**

This is a story from Luke 17 in the Bible. The Bible tells us, **as Jesus** continues on toward Jerusalem, he **reaches the border between Galilee and Samaria**. As he enters a village there, **ten people with leprosy stand at a distance** (1).

Leprosy causes terrible sores on the skin that hurt very badly. Leprosy is believed to be extremely contagious; that means other people can get it too if they are around someone with the disease. So **when people get leprosy, they have to leave the city and** live with the other lepers. They have to **stay away from all other people** (2) so no one else will get this terrible disease.

**The men with leprosy are crying out, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us! (3)” He looks at them and says, “Go show yourselves to the priest. (4)” And as they go, they are cleansed of their leprosy (5).**

**One of them comes back to Jesus when** he sees that **he is healed and shouts, “Praise God! (6)” He falls to the ground at Jesus’ feet, thanking him (7)** for what he has done. This man is a Samaritan, a foreigner.

**Jesus asks, “Didn’t I heal ten men? Where are the other nine? (8)** Has no one returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?” And **Jesus says** to the man, **“Stand up and go. Your faith has healed you. (9)”**

**Key Point:** God has the power to heal!
