



## Relational – Lesson 4

**Memory Verse:** Genesis 1:27 “God created man in his own image.”

**Key Point:** God created us to have a relationship with him!

**Bible Verse:** Genesis 3, John 3:16–18

### SCHEDULE:

#### Center Time

*around 10 minutes*

Help the individuals transition by actively engaging them from the beginning. Try setting up centers to color, play with blocks and Play-Doh, or do puzzles.

#### Five Finger Gospel (optional)

**LESSON:**

God created the heavens and the earth. He made day and night, seas and dry land, flowers, trees, all the animals, and even people! And it was good! He also made a beautiful garden called Eden. **God put Adam and Eve in the Garden to "work it and watch over it. (1)"**

**There was one rule Adam and Eve were supposed to follow (2)** in Eden. **They were told** by God, **"You may eat the fruit of every tree in the garden-except the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (3)." Adam and Eve chose to sin by eating the fruit (4).** Because of their sin, they couldn't live in the Garden of Eden with God anymore. **Because of sin**, brokenness is in the world and life is not the way God wanted it to be for us. **Adam and Eve broke their relationship with God and could not fix it (5)** and neither can we.

**God loves us so much that he wants us to be in a good relationship with him (6).** He doesn't want our relationship with him to be broken. Even though we choose sin, God chose to make a way to fix our relationship with him. **God sent his son Jesus to take the punishment for us (7).** He is the only person who NEVER disobeyed God or sinned.

Because **Jesus never sinned**, He did not deserve to be punished for sin. **But because he loves us, Jesus died on the cross and took all of our sin (8)** on himself. He took our punishment instead. If we trust him as the one who paid for our sin and we are sorry we disobeyed, he forgives and forgets all of our sin! **Not only does Jesus fix what we broke, but he makes it even better than before (9)!** The Bible says he makes us brand new. **Even though we do sin, we can have a relationship with God because of Jesus (10).** He loves us that much!

Sin is the cause of brokenness, but Jesus makes relationships with God whole again. We can choose to follow Jesus and have our sins forgotten and our relationship with him whole again.

**Key Point:** God created us to have a relationship with him!
