



Rescuer – Lesson 1

Memory Verse: “God loved the world so much that he gave his one and only Son. Anyone who believes in him will not die but will have eternal life.” John 3:16 (NIRV)

Key Point: God sent his Son, Jesus, to rescue us from our sin!

Bible Verse: Luke 1:26–38, Matthew 1:18–25

SCHEDULE:

LESSON:

Christmas is coming up soon, and it is a very special holiday! Our lessons over the next few weeks are about God sending his Son, Jesus, to earth. He came to rescue us from our sinful ways and lead us back to himself. **This is the story of Christmas** (1) and what Christmas is all about.

Starting back with Adam and Eve, the first two people God created, **all people** throughout the Bible **have sinned** (2). **Sin causes us to be separated from God** (3). Sin is anything that we do or think that is not pleasing to God. Sins are things like not obeying parents, hurting someone, thinking unkind thoughts about another person, longing for something that someone else has, and many more things. Even **from the beginning, God planned** a way **to rescue us from being separated from him** (4). **He planned to send his own Son to pay for our sins** (5)! That is wonderful news, isn't it?

God chooses a Jewish girl named **Mary to be the mother of Jesus** (6). **God sends the angel Gabriel to tell Mary that God has chosen her**. When Gabriel goes to see Mary, he says, "Do not be afraid, Mary, because you have pleased God, and he has chosen you **to be the mother of his Son** (7), Jesus. Jesus will be great and he will be called the Son of the Highest."

At first, Mary doesn't understand. You see, Mary doesn't understand **because she isn't married yet, but she is going to marry** a man named **Joseph** (8). She wants to know how this could happen. **Gabriel tells her that the Holy Spirit will put baby Jesus inside of her** (9), and the baby she has will be the Son of God! Wow, that is amazing! Nothing like that had ever happened before and has not happened since. **Mary tells the angel** she belongs to God, and **she will do whatever God wants her to do**. **And then she worships God** (10). She is very glad God has chosen her to be Jesus' mother.

Key Point: God sent his Son, Jesus, to rescue us from our sin!
