



All-Knowing – Lesson 1

2s and 3s

Memory Verse: Hebrews 1:1 “Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets...”

Key Point: God knows everything!

Bible Verse: Isaiah 6

SCHEDULE:

Center Time

around 10 minutes

Help the individuals transition by actively engaging them from the beginning. Try setting up centers to color, play with blocks and Play-Doh, or do puzzles.

Lesson

- Read through the lesson below. For a shortened version, just read the bolded words.

Activity

Five Finger Gospel (optional)

LESSON:

This is a story from Isaiah 6 in **the Bible** (1). A long time ago—long before all of God’s words in the Bible were written down—**God saw that his** own special **people** were in trouble. They decided that they **did not want to listen and** follow God’s ways. They did not love God or obey him. God’s people **were choosing their own sinful ways** (2) and not God’s way. God wanted to help his people. God loves his people very much. **So, God asked a man named** **Isaiah to be a special messenger to take his words to the people** (3). This messenger is called a prophet.

Before God asks Isaiah to take a message to his people, God wants Isaiah to know something very important. **God lets Isaiah “peek” into Heaven in a special dream so he can tell God’s people what he sees** (4). **Isaiah sees a great big throne**—a special chair **for a king to sit on, and he sees a great beautiful fan-**

cy robe that a king would wear (5). It is so long that it fills up the whole room! Isaiah is seeing a very special place for a very special king. The king is God! **God is showing Isaiah that he is the greatest king of all (6)!** **Isaiah also sees some amazing creatures** praising God. These creatures have six wings! They are **singing, “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty** (7). The whole earth is filled with his glory!” Only God is perfectly holy. Holy means no sin—perfectly good!

Isaiah cries out to God because he knows that God is SO holy and he sees that he is NOT holy. He is full of sin and so are God's people. **But God shows Isaiah that his sins are forgiven (8)!** **One of the creatures** flies over and **touches Isaiah's mouth with hot coal and says** to him, **“This has touched your lips.** Your guilt has been taken away **and your sin has been paid for.”** (9)

God gave Isaiah a message to take to his people: that God is holy and they need to turn and follow him! God knows everything, and he knows our sin. God has to judge sin because he is holy. But God made a plan to wash away our sin and make us brand new because he loves us.

Key Point: God knows everything!

Review Questions

1. Who did God ask to be a prophet? (Isaiah.)
2. When God gave Isaiah a special dream, where was Isaiah able to “peek” into? (Heaven.)
3. Isaiah saw that God is the greatest _____ of all? (King!)
4. Why did God have to send a message to his people? (They were not listening and obeying God; they were not loving and worshiping the one true God.)
5. God never sins. He is _____? (Holy.)

ACTIVITIES:

God's Message Megaphone

Supplies:

- Megaphone half sheet (one per child)
- Stickers (two-three per child)

Give each child a megaphone half sheet. Have them color and decorate it with stickers. Then, help them turn the half sheet into a megaphone by rolling the paper until the “O” is over the “X.” Tape the “O” corner and the top to secure the megaphone cone. Remind them that God used the prophets to send his message. Go over the memory verse with them a few times. Show them how the megaphone works and encourage the children to use their megaphone when they practice saying the memory verse from today.

***Have fun and let them do the crafts themselves, as much as possible. This is a hands-on way for them to learn who God is and remember what they learn. It doesn't matter if they place the label or stickers in the wrong spot. What matters is teaching them who God is. ***

Memory Verse Telephone

Ask the children to sit in a circle to play a game of listening. Tell the children, **“We are going to play a game where it is very important to listen. I will whisper a message to the person on my left and they will then whisper to the next friend until the message makes it all the way around the circle.”** Break down the verse into three or four words at a time, depending on what the children can remember, and whisper it into the first child's ear. Encourage the children to listen carefully and repeat what they hear to the next friend. When you are finished, remind the children that God is all-knowing and it is important that we listen to him. We can hear God when we spend time with him by praying to him and reading his words in the Bible. He knows everything, and he loves us and knows what is best for us.
