Big Idea: We can depend on God no matter what is going on in our lives.

Discussion Questions: Scripture Used: 1 Samuel 1:24-28

- What was the hardship that Hannah was facing?
 - What was Hannah's response to the hardship she was facing?
- Why did Hannah give her baby back to God?
- We saw that Hannah was dependent on God in the tough seasons, and the good seasons. What are some tough or good things that are going on in your life right now?
 - What does dependence look like in that situation?

Mosaic Questions:

Please incorporate these questions into your above discussion

1. What is something Hannah wanted?
2. Why did Hannah give her son up to God?
3. What was the prayer God answered for Hannah?
4. As Christians, can we still suffer if we are depending on God?



Fusion | Depending on God

Small Group Activity:

Supplies:

- 1 water bottle per group
- 1 sandwich size plastic bag per group
- one very sharp pencil per group

Instructions:

1. Ask for one volunteer who trusts you to help with the activity
2. Pour the bottle of water into the plastic bag, and zip the bag closed
3. Hold the bag of water over the volunteers head
4. Ask the volunteer: do you trust that I won't pour this entire bag of water on your head? (wait for answer) What if I poke a hole in this bag with this pencil, and promise you won't get wet - do you still trust me? (wait for answer)
5. Poke a hole all the way through the bag above the water line while the bag is still over their head.
6. Ask the volunteer: did you get wet?
7. Share with your group: sometimes in life, it can feel like we are getting poked with holes - hard things happen. Trusting God is a lot like trusting that you wouldn't get wet when I held the bag of water over your head. It gets harder the more holes that get poked in the bag, just like it's harder to trust God the more that bad things happen. We can and should trust God no matter the circumstances.
