



LESSON 17 SKIT

Principle: God is powerful.

Bible Character(s): Moses

Scripture Reference: Exodus 7-12



PERSONAL PREPARATION: Before this weekend, please read Exodus 7-12. Look at the power God displayed over the Egyptian gods. He sent the plagues in order to show His power and that He is Lord. There were plagues that the magicians could imitate, just like there are things the world can imitate, but God showed Himself more powerful in the end. Also take note of the faithfulness God showed to the Israelites throughout the plagues and by leading them out of Egypt. What are some things this world has that keep you from seeing God as powerful and Lord of all? Do you truly believe in His power to do all things? Do you believe that His power can rest on you? When you pray, do you believe that He is powerful enough to do whatever you ask if it is His will? Do you pray with this belief in His power knowing that it might not be His will?



BIG GROUP TIME - 35-40 minutes

1) Run-through/Prayer

Run-through order of service (assigned parts, transitions, slides for music and skit, video if applicable, etc), assign door greeters, pray, mic check

2) Welcome Cabins

Band member says, "Welcome to Camp Grace!" before intro song

3) Intro Song

4) Camp Competition

Heads or Tails

Tell every camper to stand up and tell them the host is going to flip a coin and they have to choose to indicate either heads (hands in an arch above their heads) or tails (hands clasped behind their

backs). The host then flips the coin. If the camper matches, they stay standing. If they don't match, they sit back down. Keep playing until there is one camper left standing to win for the week.

Script:

Host: It's great to see all of you at Camp Grace this morning. We've been talking about Moses. Last week we learned that God called Moses to go to Egypt to tell the Pharaoh to let the Israelites go. Let's see if you learned anything last week. Can anyone tell me why the Israelites couldn't just pack their bags and leave? (They were slaves.) That's right. They lived for many, many years as slaves to the Egyptians. Now, one more question from last week's lesson: How did Moses feel about going to speak to Pharaoh? (He was afraid.) He was terrified. He didn't feel that he was the right person to go, but God assured Moses that He would be right there with him, giving Moses all he needed to do the job.

When Pharaoh wouldn't listen to Moses and refused to let the Israelites go, God sent plagues that would show His power. See, the Egyptians put their faith in false gods. They even believed that Pharaoh was a god. The plagues showed the Egyptians that God is the one true God and that He is all-powerful. Let's take a look at this clip from "The Prince of Egypt".

(Dim lights and play video clip.)

(Bring lights back up.)

Host: God is powerful. There is nothing that He can't do, and we can have faith in His power. Let's pray.

God, we thank You that You are all-powerful. There is none like You. Thank you that the power we see in the story of Moses is the same power that works in our lives. Be with us as we go to our cabins. Open our hearts and help us to see how powerful You are. Amen.
