## SCENARIO 1

2. How did Freddie disobey God?
3. What was Freddie's plan?
4. What was God's plan?
5. Which plan did Freddie trust?
6. Freddie asked for his plan; did God give it to him?
7. Why was God's plan better than Freddie's?

## SCENARIO 2

Kate really wanted to bake cookies to send to her friend overseas. She thought it would be a nice thing to do for her friend. Her mom does not allow her to use the oven by herself, so she asks her mom if she can bake cookies with her mom's help. Her mom is about to leave to go to a meeting and will not be back until after Kate goes to bed, so she says no. Kate explains to her mom why she wants to bake the cookies, and that she needs to do it that night so she can send them the next day. Her mom tells her that while it's a sweet idea, Kate is not allowed to use the oven while her mom is not there because she's not old enough to use it alone. Kate understands and obeys her mom's decision, knowing that things could turn out badly if she were to disobey.
