



## LESSON 59 SKIT

Principle: Don't Worry. Trust God.

Bible Character(s): Jesus

Scripture Reference: Matthew 6:25-34



### **PERSONAL PREPARATION:** Before this weekend, read the following scripture

references: Matthew 6:25-34, Philippians 4:6-8, 1 Peter 5:7, and Psalm 46:10. This week, we will study about Jesus' teaching on worry. The definition of worry is *to afflict with mental distress or agitation; make anxious*. When we worry, we ultimately question and doubt God's sovereignty and goodness. We fall to the temptation to believe that God is not who He says He is, and we must handle our concerns ourselves. The root of worry is a fear that God cannot provide what we need. God has already provided everything we need and showed His love through Jesus' death and resurrection. He poured out the punishment for our sin on His only Son. We can trust a God who died for us so that we can have eternal life and a restored relationship with Him. He knows each of us better than we know ourselves, and He has a plan that is for our good. Jesus calls us to trust in His sovereignty.

How do you struggle with believing that God will provide for you? How can you fight against the temptation to worry? Spend a few minutes thinking about examples of things you tend to worry about. Pray for God to show you that He is bigger than any worry in your life, and to trust in Him with your worries and concerns.

Staff Member #1 (A nervous wreck - the type of person who panics under pressure. Staff Member #1 says Parents Weekend over and over in the script to remind everyone to worry about it.)

Staff Member #2 (Very relaxed - think Surfer Dude Lifeguard.)

Staff Member #3 (Worried about fashion)

### Props:

"Parents Weekend at Camp Grace" sign

Song: "Don't Worry. Be Happy"

Birds chirping sound fx

3 shirts (for Staff Member #3)

2 Pots with fake flowers

### Script:

Staff Member #1: (Runs around frantically checking things, looking at a list.) **Hey kids! It's Parents Weekend. Parents are coming to Camp Grace to visit. They get a chance to see how we do things. We want to make them feel welcome and comfortable. So, there's a lot to do. A lot!**

\*\*\*SOUND: Song "Don't Worry, Be Happy" begins to play.

Staff Member #2 slowly enters, dancing along to the song.

Staff Member #2: (\*\*SOUND: Fade music.) What's up?

Staff Member #1: What's up is that I've been wondering where you've been. I've been running around all over campus getting things ready for Parents Weekend. Parents Weekend - does that mean anything at all to you?

Staff Member #2: Dude, I'm so ready for Parents Weekend. Parents rock. I can't wait to slap a few "high fives" with some of the parental units of our beloved campers. I plan to sit at their feet and collect buckets of wisdom from them. It will be an awesome weekend.

Staff Member #1: Well, you are not going to be able to sit at anyone's feet holding your bucket if things don't get done. There's still so much to do to get ready. They'll be here at any minute now. I'm doing everything. Contrary to popular belief, Parents Weekend doesn't just come together. A lot of work goes into it. I've been doing all the work.

\*\*SOUND: play song again

\*\*SOUND: fade music

Staff Member #2: Time out, my fellow staffers.

Staff Member #1: Time out? I don't have time for a time-out. I've got so much work to do.

Staff Member #2: Take a moment of your franticness to look up. Look up into the blue spacious skydom.

(All the staffers look up.)

Staff Member #3: That is a nice blue. Note to self: purchase a shirt in sky blue.

Staff Member #1: What are we looking at?

\*\*\*SOUND: bird sound fx

Staff Member #2: Our fine-feathered dudes, the birds.

Staff Member #1: And, why are we looking at the birds?

Staff Member #2: They totally have no worries. Ever noticed?

(All staffers look away from the ceiling.)

Staff Member #3: Thanks for the bird watching, but I've got an outfit to put together.

Staff Member #2: Wait, dude. Look at the flowers.

Staff Member #3: Another great color choice, but I really have to go.

Staff Member #1: I've got to go, too. It's Parents Weekend and it's not going to come together by itself.

Staff Member #2: Before you go, dudes, I just wanted to school you on what Jesus said about the birds and the flowers. He pointed out that they had no worries, dude.

Staff Member #1: Well, of course they never worry. They don't have important things like Parents Weekend to plan.

Staff Member #2: Exactamundo! We are way more important to Him than flowers and birds. But, dude, check this out. God takes complete and total care of the birds and flowers. If He takes care of them, then He will surely take care of us because we're so important to Him. The birds and flowers have no worries because God takes care of them. He takes care of us, too.
