

Scenarios

Read through each scenario and ask the campers how they could serve others in each situation.

1. Your mom spent a lot of time making a really nice meal for your family. After dinner, your brother and sister help clear off the table, and then they leave while your mom starts cleaning up the kitchen.
2. At school, one of the kids in your class is walking down the hall at the same time as you. He stops to get a book out of his backpack and ends up dropping all of his books on the ground.
3. While you're playing with one of your toys, your little sister asks your dad to read her a book. Your dad is working from home and has to spend a couple more hours working before he can read to her.
4. In your Camp Grace cabin there are not enough Bibles for each camper to have one. You brought your own Bible, but the camper next to you does not have one.
5. You and your little brother are staying with your grandparents for the weekend while your parents go out of town. Your grandma always spends Saturday morning cleaning the house and your grandpa always spends the morning working in the yard.
6. Your mom comes in one morning while you're playing video games and she asks you to clean up the basement. She leaves the house to run errands and says she'll be back by lunchtime.
7. At school your class is getting ready to make a really fun craft. Your teacher has a lot of supplies that need to be passed out to everyone.

Examples of Serving Others

Ask for volunteers to act out how they could potentially serve others in each of the following situations.

1. Getting in line.
2. Getting a snack (especially if there are not enough for everyone).
3. Getting water from the water fountain.
4. Walking through a doorway with a group.
5. Choosing seats at the table (especially if there are not enough for everyone).
6. Someone dropping something he/she is carrying.
