Principle: We are to be united.

Bible Character: Paul

Scripture Reference: 1Corinthians 1:10, 12:12-26



PERSONAL PREPARATION: Before this weekend, read through the scripture

references, and think about the different parts of the body. How do they interact? Are all parts needed for the body to function well? How is the physical body related to the body of Christ? The body of Christ was designed by God. Everyone has the same purpose, to believe and trust in Jesus as Lord and to glorify God, however each member was also created uniquely by God with a role to play in the body of Christ. God created the body of Christ to work together with the same purpose, and within that experiencing suffering and joy together. Have you recognized how God has uniquely created and gifted you for your role in the body of Christ? What influence are you providing? How are you impacted by others in the church? How can understanding that we each have a part to play change your responses to others? At the end of the lesson, we will encourage campers to pray for one another to encourage unity among them. Spend some time in prayer for your campers and for the body of Christ.



BIG GROUP TIME - 35-40 minutes

1) Run-through/Prayer

Run-through order of service (assigned parts, transitions, slides for music and skit, video if applicable, etc), assign door greeters, pray, mic check

2) Welcome Cabins

3) Intro Song

4) Camp Competition

Two 1-cup measuring cups of water to act as milk (one should be in front of Staff Member #2's mixing bowl and one should be in front of Ms. Bea's mixing bowl)

2 mixing spoons (one should be in front of [Staff Member #3]'s mixing bowl and the other should be in front of Ms. Bea's)

1 chocolate cake

Script:

Scene 1

Host: Welcome to Camp Grace. It's time for my favorite television show. I was going to watch it in my cabin, but decided to come watch with you guys. So, let's watch a little television together.

(Theme music plays.)

Ms. Bea: Well, hello. It's so good to be with you today on another 'Cooking with Ms. Bea' episode. I love sharing my favorite recipes with you. On today's show, we'll be making Ms. Bea's famous chocolate cake. There's just nothing like a big slice of Ms. Bea's chocolate cake and a glass of cold milk. As always, I've invited some friends to join us in the kitchen today. These are two of my favorite boys from Camp Grace. Won't you welcome my friends, [Staff Member #3] and [Staff Member #2]?

(Staff Member #3 and Staff Member #2 enter. They take their places on either side of Ms. Bea where a mixing bowl will be set up for them.)

Ms. Bea: Welcome, boys. I'm so glad you could come and be with me today.

Staff Member #3: Hidey Ms. Bea. I'm just so pleased to be here. It's so kind of you to invite me back to your show. You know the last time I was here so many people saw me that, well, I became a celebrity.

Ms. Bea: Oh, that's nice [Staff Member #3].

Staff Member #2: And I, too, had my fifteen minutes of fame the last time I was on the show. It was righteous, Ms. Bea.

Ms. Bea: I remember your visit well. You tried to teach me to surf. You jumped up on this very table to show me some of your surfing moves.

Staff Member #2: I totally schooled you well, Ms. Bea. I saw you catching a wave on Lake Swim-or-Drown just the other day.

Ms. Bea: I was trying to do all you taught me. We always have such fun on the show. Today, I'm going to teach you boys to bake your favorite Camp Grace dessert, Ms. Bea's chocolate cake.

Staff Member #3: I'm so excited, Ms. Bea, I just can't stand it.

Staff Member #2: Shaa! Your chocolate cake is my most favorite dessert ever. I'm totally stoked to learn to bake it myself.

Ms. Bea: Let's get started. Prior to the show, our staff placed all the ingredients we would need in front of our individual mixing bowls. When I tell you to add an ingredient, you just follow along. Before you know it, we'll have three beautiful chocolate cakes to enjoy. First, you'll need one cup of flour. Just pour the flour into your mixing bowl, boys.

Staff Member #3: (Hold measuring cup very high and pour from there.) Ewweee! This is fun, Ms. Bea!

Ms. Bea: The next step is to take your spoons and make a well in your flour like so.

(Ms. Bea makes a well; Staff Member #2 can't seem to find a spoon. He looks all around. He shrugs and uses his hand to make the well.)

Ms. Bea: Did everyone make your well?

Staff Member #3: Yes ma'am.

Staff Member #2: I totally dug a well in my flour, dude.

Ms. Bea: Now, we're going to add our liquid ingredients to the center of the well. Forming the well is essential to mixing the ingredients well. Now, you'll see a measuring cup of milk. Pour that milk right in the middle of your well.

(Staff Member #3 searches for milk. He looks all around. He turns around. He gets on the floor and crawls around looking for the milk.)

Ms. Bea: [Staff Member #3], stop that playing. Let's continue.

Staff Member #3: But Ms. Bea... I...

Ms. Bea: [Staff Member #3], you're always trying to make me laugh. But, honey, we have a show to do. So, stay with us. (Staff Member #3 shrugs.) Next, crack your two eggs and pour them into the area where you have the milk. (Ms. Bea and Staff Member #2 crack their eggs. Staff Member #3 looks for eggs in a comical way.) [Staff Member #3], what in the world?! If you want your cake to turn out well, you'll need to focus. (Staff Member #3 shrugs again.) Now, here is one of the most important steps. We're going to mix our ingredients. Each ingredient is important and they need to be mixed well into one batter. Get your spoons ready. (Staff Member #2 looks around for his spoon.) Now, stir. You'll go in a clockwise direction like so. (Staff Member #2 shrugs and sticks his hand into the batter, stirring with his hand.) I'm going to come to each of your mixing bowls to see how you're doing. (Ms. Bea looks into Staff Member #3's bowl.) [Staff Member #3], you have nothing there, but flour.

Staff Member #3: Look at that well. Have you ever seen a better flour well?

Ms. Bea: That is a nice well, but what about the milk and the eggs?

Staff Member #3: I couldn't find them Ms. Bea.

Ms. Bea: Oh dear. How about you [Staff Member #2]? Do you have your milk and eggs?

Staff Member #2: (Lifts his hand to scratch his nose.) **Totally.**

Ms. Bea: **What happened to your hand? Where on earth is your mixing spoon?**

Staff Member #2: I looked high and low, but dude, no spoon was to be found. I just used my hand.

Ms. Bea: **We're going to go to a commercial and try to solve this problem. We'll be back.**

Commercial (Optional)

Announcer: **Camp Grace Skits – so easy an ape can do them.**

Counselor: **So, can you tell me what bothers you about the Camp Grace skits?**

Ape: I don't even have lines. They have me grunting the whole time. Just because I'm an ape doesn't mean I only grunt. It's so insulting.

Counselor: **So, you're telling me that you, an ape, can hold an intelligent conversation?**

Ape: I can quote Shakespeare for goodness sakes. "How like a winter hath my absence been, fom thee, the pleasure of the fleeting year!"

Counselor: **I can't understand a word you're saying.**

(Ape puts his head in his hands and shakes his head.)

Announcer: **Camp Grace Skits – so easy an ape can do them.**

(Staff Member #3 and Staff Member #2 are standing together in the middle.)

Scene 2

Ms. Bea: **We're back. If you just tuned in, we were attempting to bake three chocolate cakes. [Staff Member #3] had flour, but no milk or eggs. [Staff Member #2] had flour, milk, and eggs, but no mixing spoon. We simply cannot bake a cake without all the ingredients. See, all the ingredients are important and they must be mixed well into one batter. We stopped during the commercial break to take a little inventory. It seems someone made a mistake. [Staff Member #3] had ingredients that [Staff Member #2] didn't have. [Staff Member #2] had ingredients that [Staff Member #3] didn't have. So, we came up with a plan.**

Staff Member #3: **We put the ingredients I had with the ingredients my buddy, here, had.**

Staff Member #2: Dude, it was amazing. By putting [Staff Member #3]'s ingredients with my ingredients, we totally had all the ingredients for one bodacious chocolate cake.

Staff Member #3: Every single one of those ingredients was important. They were mixed together to make one, just one cake.

Staff Member #2: So cool.

Ms. Bea: (Show the chocolate cake.) Each person had different things to contribute. But, when we put everything together, we were able to bake this beautiful chocolate cake. You know, that reminds me of something the Bible says. Christians are one body. God gives us all different gifts and abilities, but they all work together for Him. God combines our gifts and abilities like the ingredients of a cake and brings it all together into one wonderful body like this chocolate cake.

Staff Member #3: If we left out one of our ingredients our cake wouldn't look or taste good.

Staff Member #2: God uses everyone's gifts and talents. They are all a totally valuable part of the body, dude. No one can be left out.

Ms. Bea: We weren't able to show you every step of the recipe, but you can get the steps online at Ms.BeaCooks.com. We were able to show you something much more important than how to make a chocolate cake. We were able to show you that Christians are one body. Every gift and ability is important. Everyone waves as theme music plays.
