SETTING THE ATMOSPHERE

As children arrive, collect the “In” slips from parents and see which grade they are in for their huddle teams. Remember to check all slips to make sure children are to be in Up & Out this hour.

Team Time

Each team leader (student leader) should spend time getting a conversation started within the team to find out more about each child. Spend time today discussing the following questions up front...

- What do you remember about our Proverbs unit?
- Of those that you remember, how have you applied them in your daily life?

LESSON HUDDLE

Can you believe that we have spent the past ten weeks looking at different proverbs in the Bible? They must be pretty important for God to want to include them in His Word. Let's make one final review of what a proverb is?

Proverbs are “short sayings that are in the Bible that give a simple truth to live a more godly life.” Remember the word “proverb” means “to be like.” Learning and hearing about the proverbs in our Bible help us to be more like Jesus so it is definitely worth our time to have studied a few of them, right?

Do any of you remember any of the proverbs that we talked about? (allow time for answers) If so, what does that proverb mean? How have you tried to use it in your life? (If no one gives an answer, try to remind the kids of one that you remember and how you applied it). Below you will find all 10 Proverb verses that were covered. Use them to help guide your conversation with the kids. Try to see how the kids have used the different proverbs in their daily lives. Remind them of the value there is in studying God's Word, even through the book of Proverbs.

Proverbs 10:19

Too much talk leads to sin. Be sensible and keep your mouth shut.

Proverbs 27:1

Don't brag about tomorrow, since you don't know what the day will bring.

Proverbs 18:10

The name of the Lord is a strong fortress; the godly run to him and are safe.

Proverbs 25:11

Timely advice is lovely, like golden apples in a silver basket.

Proverbs 12:15

Fools think their own way is right, but the wise listen to others.

Proverbs 13:4

Lazy people want much but get little, but those who work hard will prosper.

Proverbs 1:7

Fear of the Lord is the foundation of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline.

Proverbs 15:1

A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare

Proverbs 3:5-6

Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight.

Proverbs 3:3

Never let loyalty and kindness leave you! Tie them around your neck as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart.

OUR FAVORITE ACTIVITIES FROM OUR PROVERBS UNIT

Cup Pyramid Tower (Proverbs 18:10)

Take small, paper cups and build a pyramid against one of your walls. This will give it extra support to be extra tall. Depending on the number of kids, break up into smaller groups and have several wall towers going at once.



Simon Says (Proverbs 12:15)

Play as many rounds as you like of “Simon Says.” Remember our crafts/activities are chosen to go along with the huddle time, so remind the kids of what was talked about between rounds. Keep emphasizing and repeating the proverb discussed (Proverbs 12:15)

Trusting Obstacle Course (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Divide the class into two teams. Set up a simple obstacle course using items in the class (blocks, chair, or even paper). This can also be done outside if space allows. Have kids take turns being blind folded and being lead through the obstacle course by a teammate. Make sure kids walk and do not run for safety reasons. Talk about trusting God just like you have to trust your teammate when you are blindfolded.



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
